HUGGATE INCLOSURE AWARD CHARITY

Some of you will know that the sale of a piece of land next to the Quarry in 2002 realised a little over £8000. This money is held in the Huggate Inclosure Award Charity, to be used "to promote such charitable purposes for the general benefit of the [Parish of Huggate] as the trustee thinks fit", with the Parish Council as Trustee. There has since been a lack of clarity over the administration of this charity. I am pleased to report that the Trustees have now sought guidance from the Charity Commissioners and are able to access the fund for appropriate uses. The Trustee is therefore seeking suggestions from you, the residents, for the use of this fund.

I would be grateful if you could let me, as the Chair of the of Trustees, Barbara Hale (Treasurer) or Linda Davies (Secretary) have any suggestions by the end of March, to enable us to present options for discussion at the Annual Village Meeting on 26th April.

CAN YOU HELP? - PARISH COUNCIL RECORDS

The Parish Council has for some time been trying to locate its historic records. Parish Councils were set up in the 19th century and are required by law to keep their Minutes and other records in perpetuity. The records currently held date only date back to 1992. The Council has recently been asked by the East Riding Archives at The Treasure House to report on the whereabouts of its records, none of which are held by the Archives or local libraries.
