## HUGGATE PARISH COUNCIL

At the February meeting the Council:

- Considered the scoping document for the Environmental Impact Assessment for a proposal for two wind turbines at South Grange
- Noted the level of traffic movements agreed by the Planning Permissions recently granted for Newby Farm
- Identified maintenance needs for the Play Area
- Discussed possible monitoring of traffic volume and speed through the village

At the March meeting the Council will consider a planning application for a wind turbine at Fox Covert Farm, and discuss producing a village emergency plan for severe weather situations and other eventualities.
