## FOOD WASTE RECYCLING CADDIES

East Riding of Yorkshire Council has been delivering caddies and liners, street by street since March so that residents can send food waste for composting, keeping it out of landfill. Huggate residents are due to receive their caddies by mid June.

All types of food waste can be put in the caddies, including plate scraps, cooked food, bones, tea bags and egg shells. The caddy liners, once tied, trap inside the waste and any smells.

Cardboard of all types, like cereal boxes and packaging, can be put in the brown bins. It must be stripped of wrapping, cellophane and sticky tape, be slit and flattened and placed loose in the brown bin.

### HOWEVER

please do not use put these items in the brown bin until you receive the kitchen caddy. The brown bin is for garden waste only. Food waste cannot be added to this as it is (up to you receiving a caddy) composted outside. Anything containing food must be (by law) composted indoors under closely controlled conditions. This is known as In Vessel composting, whereby the waste must reach a specific temperature for a length of time before it is deemed safe. This legislation was brought out in 2003 in response to the Foot and Mouth outbreak. Once you get the kitchen caddy the waste collected in the brown bin will be sent to an in vessel facility in the East Riding.
