## NEWS FROM HUGGATE PARISH COUNCIL

### Induction and Training day

Four people left the Council at the end of their term in May, and Council welcomed 4 new members in May and June this year. 2 left in August and another in October. So we now have a new team, and decided both new and existing members needed to spend some time getting to know each other and finding ways of working together, as a team. We had an induction/team building afternoon on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> October 2011, at Wetwang Village Hall. The aim of the day was to improve the way Huggate Parish Council functions and to use the discussions, thoughts and conclusions as the basis for an induction pack for future new Councillors. The topics we discussed included: the remit of Huggate Parish Council and the role of the Parish Clerk, a review of the Code of Conduct and DVD, the councils Standard Orders and how we put them into practice, the decision making process and how we make decisions.

It was a useful day and we covered a lot of material. It was clear that another meeting would be useful, to consider developing a Parish Plan; how the Council responds to planning application consultations and whether we need a strategy, with clear criteria of how planning applications should be dealt with as they arise; our Standing Orders and the use of committees and advisory groups. A big advantage of doing this outside the usual HPC Business meetings is that we have more time to consider and discuss issues that aren't on the HPC business agenda. It is not meant to replace the usual HPC meetings and no decisions will be taken. Instead, proposals and plans can be developed to bring to the HPC meetings for open discussion and vote.
