Falling foul of the Law

Children playing out during the holidays have on occasions had their games spoiled by encountering dog mess on the grass areas in the village.

At the Drifffield Show the East Riding Dog Wardens were publicising the problem of nuisance caused by dog mess.

The law is that on “all land in the open air within the East Riding of Yorkshire to which the public have access to either with or without payment”, it is an offence for “a person in charge of a dog to allow it to foul and then fail to clear up the faeces forthwith”. They point out that this covers all accessible land, not just footpaths and pavements, and that “forthwith” means **immediate removal**, not moving it to one side, or leaving it for later removal, or leaving it wrapped in a plastic bag.

The area dog warden is willing to visit anyone reported as failing to clear up their dog’s mess, and explain that a substantial fine can be incurred. The area warden is Ron Keight, who can be contacted on 01482 396300.
