

Could you help to knit DRESSES FOR ETHIOPIAN BABIES?

Rozelle Tilburn asks—

I have been asked to knit dresses for Ethiopian babies. The pattern is very simple, even children could knit these garments. These dresses will be passed on to East Riding Voluntary Action Services, who send them to the charity Maternity Worldwide, which works to improve the care of mothers in developing countries. I am willing to help anyone who is ready to have a go. Any finished dresses can either be dropped off at Willow Lodge or brought to my Craft Stall at the July Summer Fair.



PATTERN

Double knitting wool, size 6 needles
Darkish colour(s) preferred, NOT white
which is the colour of mourning

Cast on 44 stitches

Rib (knit 2, purl 2) 18 rows

Stocking stitch (knit 1 row, purl 1 row) 30 rows

Cast on 12 stitches at the beginning of the next 2 rows—total 68 stitches

Rib (knit 2, purl 2) 22 rows

Rib 21 stitches, cast off 26, rib remaining 21

Rib 21 stitches, cast on 21, rib remaining 21

Rib 22 rows

Cast off 12 stitches at the beginning of the next 2 rows

Stocking stitch 30 rows

Rib 18 rows.

Cast off.

Stitch up side and arm seams

Charity shops usually have boxes of odd balls of yarn.

(The Pocklington Trader shop has 100g balls of acrylic for £1.25—makes 2 dresses. Works fine on circular needles if you hate doing seams! Google “fish and chip babies” for information about babies wrapped in newspaper because there are no clothes. JZ)
