News from Huggate Parish Council

Snow clearance

It's getting to that nippy time of the year again. So HPC is looking at the various grants available from East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) so that we can again add to the snow clearance service currently funded directly by ERYC. This includes extending snow clearance to all streets in the village that can be accessed by snow clearance vehicles and equipment and ensuring a good supply of salt/grit. The existing heaps and bins have been re-stocked and we are looking at the feasibility of additional salt supplies to help people in the village keep pavements safe for pedestrians.

Planning

Richard Welch from ERYC Forward Planning Department came to meet councillors and some of the people who live on Church View who may be affected by the proposed changes to the development limits. The proposal is to include the buildings on the site of St. Mary's Barn yard within the development limit as a potential rounding off to the built form of Huggate. It was a useful meeting and it was noted that any development would be subject to the usual planning process. This requires an application for planning permission which would be subject to the ERYC planning strategy and national policy.

Richard noted that key policies that would be taken into account include:

- S4: Supporting development in the Villages and The Countryside
- H1: Providing a mix of housing to meet local needs
- ENV1: Integrating high quality design
- ENV3: Valuing our heritage.

It was agreed that HPC and interested residents would explore ways to make sure the views of people living in the village are taken into account in the planning process both before and after any application to develop the St. Mary's site. One option is to prepare a neighbourhood development order for the site to outline key requirements expected of any development.

Clerk to Huggate Parish Council

The good news is that the current clerk, Linda Gunnell, has successfully developed her main job into a full time and more demanding post, which reflects her many skills and expertise. The bad news is that she will finish as clerk to the council in January 2014, to focus her time on her main job.

So we will be looking to appoint a new clerk. More details to follow, but if you think you could be interested, please do let me or one of the other councillors know.
