Help the Police to help you!

Approximately 55% of people who report their phones as lost or stolen, cannot provide the phone's unique reference number (IMEI).

Humberside Police are urging mobile phone owners and businesses to register all their mobile phones, along with any other valuables you wish to keep a record of, should they become lost or stolen on a free website: www.immobilise.com

You fill in a form which "will then be fired across to a dedicated SPOC box, which a member of Police staff will pick up and process the information. They will create a unique Immobilise account for you." Presumably this works even if you have no idea what a SPOC box is You can also buy a "fake tv" light which makes it look as if you are watching tv even when you are out!

POCKLINGTON ROAD CLOSURE

is now scheduled to begin on
6th June if you believe ERYC or 5th June if you believe the notices

ERYC has notified that:

Carriageway patching works are programmed to commence at the above location on Thursday 6th June 2013 and are expected to continue until Wednesday 12th June 2013. The work consists of patching repairs prior to surface dressing. The working hours will be 8am till 6pm week days.

Due to the narrow width of the carriageway, the road will be closed to through traffic and a signed diversion route will be in place for the duration of the works. The site extents and the route of the traffic diversion are shown on the plan attached to this e-mail; access through the site will only be permitted to residents and businesses whose premises are within the site extents. An access route will be maintained at all times for emergency vehicles.

During the construction of the works you can also contact the contractor’s site representative Mick Tighe on 07764358637 (mobile) should you wish to discuss any site related matters.

The map supplied (see the Huggate web site) indicates that the closure is from Mill Lane to the Millington Pasture junction, and diversion will be signposted via Warter.

The postponed work on Iron Fence Road is expected to begin on 13th June. It is estimated that the road will be closed for 2 days.

HPC - ANNUAL VILLAGE MEETING

Development Limits

HPC is arranging a meeting with Stephen Hunt from ERYC's Forward Planning Team to discuss development limits for Huggate. These define the sites available for building. The main concern was that unused sites such as Eastlands and St Mary's farm yards should be developed to prevent further dereliction. **What do you think? Are there areas in Huggate that should be outside the development limits and not built on? Are there areas in Huggate where development should be allowed?**

Emergency Plan

HPC is reviewing the emergency plan and updating the laminate cards of emergency and bad weather contacts. A suggestion from the AVM is to include contact details of volunteers who could collect prescriptions from local GPs and chemists in bad weather. **Are there other things you would like the council to do in terms of emergency planning/snow clearance? Are the laminate cards of emergency contacts useful? Does anyone have any updates we should add to them? Are you willing and able to volunteer to collect essential prescriptions etc?**

Speed and parking

Parking by walkers was discussed. A suggestion is that HPC prints notices to place on windscreens, making it clear that farm machinery and large vehicles use the roads. Parking on the roads means that these vehicles have to use the verges to get past, causing damage. However, parked vehicles are obstacles that can reduce the speed of traffic. Speed was highlighted as a continuing issue. Traffic along the top road does not keep to the 30 mph limit. Some traffic down the village drives at hazardous speeds. It is a danger for everyone but particularly to children playing on the Village Green and in and around the Crescent. **We'd appreciate your thoughts on how to encourage people to drive at a safe speed in the village.**

Footpaths and play areas

Current plans for play areas and the pit site are to keep the spaces maintained whilst encouraging development of natural play areas. Clearance on the pit site continues to make it safe for use. People at the AVM felt that both areas should be kept natural for “organic play”; but maintenance is needed and neither

should be completely wild. HPC has discussed insurance cover for the pit area with its insurers. Whilst we have cover for all the land we are responsible for, the insurers make it clear that HPC/HAPG must minimise any risk to the public and make sure the area is safe to use. This is something that needs to be done with the Pit. *In the meantime it is closed and should not be used, to comply with our insurance regulations.*

It was noted that footpaths in the village are hazardously slippery when leaves fall and are not cleared. This is not something that is dealt with by ERYC and HPC do not have the budget to pay for keeping the footpaths clear.

So, willing volunteers are needed to help out with keeping footpaths clear and maintaining the open spaces.

Jubilee Tree

The plan for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee tree was delayed by weather and other issues on the agenda. HPC decided on a fruit tree, on the old and now disused play area site, with a circular bench as an amenity for the village. Discussion at and after the AVM suggested the tree may be better on the Village Green, near the Well, with seating on the old play area. **But what sort of fruit tree? On the play area or Village Green?**

New councillor

HPC co-opted a new councillor at its Parish Council Annual Meeting. A warm welcome to Jenni Shields. There are still 3 vacancies for councillors, so if you are interested, get in touch.
