Sky Ride Local rides are free, fun, guided bike rides that offer a great way of getting out and exploring the local area with friends and family. The rides are guided by friendly British Cycling Ride Leaders along scenic planned routes. With different levels, there's something for everyone. There are three grades of ride:

- Easy-going: for all abilities and ages along relaxed, mostly traffic-free routes. They are up to six miles long, with a gentle pace of around six miles an hour.
- Steady: for the fairly confident cyclist, on mainly quiet roads. Rides are six to twenty miles, and about seven to ten miles an hour.
- Challenging: for the fairly fit and confident cyclist. Rides start at around twenty miles and are paced at between eleven and twelve miles an hour.

Rides in the East Riding start at North Dalton and Hedon on Sunday, 23 June and continue through the summer with the last ride from Pocklington on Sunday, 15 September. Erica Hunt and team achieve Trailtrekker Gold

Erica writes:

Just in case anyone hasn't heard the news by now, we fulfilled our ambitious plan and we completed the 100km (62 mile) Oxfam Trail Trekker challenge in the Yorkshire Dales on the weekend of 1st and 2nd June.

We started together, walked together and finished together as a team in 32 hours and 9 minutes with a total ascent the equivalent of Snowdon and Ben Nevis. And we were still being very polite to each other at the end!

- 340 teams signed up for the event and we were 1 of only 86 that completed the full course as a complete team
- Out of 1193 walkers that started, only 681 completed the full course

Many thanks for your support and generous donations. They really did act as a motivator in the dark hours and the long 15-20 mile last leg to the finish line. But the determination to finish was there and it's amazing what you can achieve when you really put your mind to it. We were reminded at the pre-event safety briefing that the money donated by family, friends and colleagues would result in very real people actually getting something to eat which they otherwise would not have done, or an actual village would get a clean water supply.

News from the Parish Council of **HUGGATE VILLAGE** **DEVELOPMENT LIMITS**

Barbara Hale, Jane Leaver, Noel Wright and Linda Davies met with Stephen Hunt and Richard Welch from ERYC's Forward Planning Team on 25th June to discuss the new development limits for Huggate. These define what sites are available for new buildings, whether commercial or residential and were discussed at the Annual Village Meeting.

We looked at the unused sites at Eastlands and St Mary's Barn to discuss whether these could be included in the development limits to open up the potential for small scale residential and business development. The overall conclusion was the ERYC would look at including the St. Mary's Barn site in the development limits for the village, as a first step in helping to prevent further dereliction. This would be for a few houses. **This doesn't mean that planning permission would automatically be granted, but that applications wouldn't be automatically rejected.** ERYC would also remove the recently consecrated church land from the development limits.

The advice from Stephen Hunt and Richard Welch was that HPC should explore developing a very focussed Neighbourhood Development Plan that concentrates on the Eastlands site, to give the reasons why the site should be developed and specify the types of development that the village feels are appropriate. This, if agreed, then becomes part of the ERYC planning policy for Huggate. By focussing on just one part of the village the substantial costs of preparing a Neighbourhood Development Plan can be reduced and there are small grants available to help us in preparing it. So HPC will be working on this over the coming months. One of the keys to a successful Neighbourhood Development Plan is that people in the village have an input, so **please if you have any views on the issue, do let us know.** Initial ideas for development are a mix of a limited number of small houses and small business units that are suitable for a range of uses.

Other planning news

Barbara Hale and Linda Gurnell attended a Parish/Town Council liaison meeting held at Beverley County Hall on 3rd June. A key item of discussion was the new legislation (from May 2013). There is now a three year period where formal, detailed planning applications will NOT be required for residential extensions up

to twice the size previously allowable. The process is that the house owner MUST notify ERYC of any planned extension before work commences and ERYC still have to give permission for the work to go ahead. However, the application does not need to go through the lengthy formal planning application process. Once notified, ERYC have to ensure that immediate neighbours (every house within 100 metres, sharing a common boundary) know of the planned extension and have the right to comment or object to it, within 21 days. As before, any objection needs to include a good reason. If there are no comments or objections within 42 days of ERYC being notified of the plans, then automatic planning permission is granted. Only immediate neighbours will be consulted and others in the village and the parish council will not be able to comment or object. The rules for conservation areas remain different. The extension will need to meet all relevant building regulations.

Neighbourhood Policing

On the retirement in July of Sergeant Pete Rogers, Sergeant Dave Dosdale will take over responsibility for Neighbourhood Policing.
