199 Bus Service

ERYC has written to the Parish Council about the future of the bus service. The full letter can be found on the web site, and was in the bus shelter until someone decided to remove all notices.

“Currently the 199 bus service starts at Huggate at 09.20 and ... into Pocklington for 9.50 on Tuesdays. The service returns from Pocklington at 11.25. There is another one way service which leaves Huggate at 11.57 and arrives at Pocklington at 12.27 but no return from this service. The bus has been surveyed and has very few passengers.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council has been undertaking a thorough review of supported bus services, the 199 service is presently being supported by the Council. This service emerges as being one of the poor performers but of course may be essential for a small number of people.

.... The subsidy the service attracts of over £7.70 per passenger journey ... far more than the fare charged and it carries on average less than 1 passenger a day.”

It appears that unless a need is demonstrated for the bus, or the Parish Council is willing to pay the subsidy, the service is likely to be stopped.
