LOVE WILDLIFE? WANT TO STOP RURAL CRIME? RURAL SPECIAL CONSTABLES WANTED IN THE EAST RIDING

Do you enjoy a challenge? Do you want to put something back into your local community? Have you considered becoming a Special Constable, but unsure how to go about it, what the role involves and the opportunities the role can offer?

Humberside Police would like to recruit special constables who have a passion for wildlife and rural living.

Rural crime is a priority for the police and we are determined to reduce this type of crime, farmers and people who live or work in rural areas are being asked to consider joining the police family and becoming a rural expert Special Constable.

This is an excellent opportunity for farmers and residents living in the local area to get involved in crime types that matter the most to you.

Rural theft, especially of farm equipment and machinery, fuel and metal theft can have a damaging impact on a rural community, by recruiting rural and wildlife experts in this field, knowledge will be gained and as a result will reduce and deter criminals from committing crime in the East Riding.

The public can also help reduce these types of crime by reporting suspicious activity immediately. Taking note of descriptions of those acting suspiciously, vehicle types, colours and registrations and call police as soon as possible can massively assist the police.

Special Inspector Pippa Gravi said: "The Special Constabulary is an extremely successful part of 'Team Humberside' that helps make a measurable difference to your local community."

"Special Constables compliment the unique bond between

regular officers, Police Community Support Officers and Police Volunteers and can be extremely rewarding and fulfilling. Knowing you are tackling crime that matters the most to your community.

"During my time as a Special Constable I have come into contact with public order situations, neighbourhood disputes, fights, events, house burglaries, all of which necessitate using the skills you are shown during your training period with the Force and can honestly say I love every minute of it."

What is a Special Constable?

Special Constables are warranted officers, who work alongside their Regular colleagues, supporting them in various aspects of policing, be it rural, neighbourhood, incident response to name but a few.

Interested in joining us? If you are, the first step is to make contact with South Yorkshire Police HR department on 0114 219 7000. They will advise you when a presentation evening is being staged around the area. At these presentation evenings, the Special Superintendent for Recruitment and his Team will give a talk explaining about the role of the Special Constable, what the role entails, the training that is given, what the Force expects of you, what you can expect in return, what development opportunities there are available to you. At the end of the presentation evening and if you are still interested in joining us, all you need to do is complete a form outlining your details along with an e-mail address, to which South Yorkshire Police will forward an electronic application form. If you do not have an e-mail address, a hard copy will be posted out to you. The sooner you complete the form and return it to South Yorkshire Police, the sooner they can start reviewing your application.

What are the entry requirements of the role? You need to be over 18, have no criminal record and be able to give minimum 16 hours per month to the Force as operational duty time.

The role of the Special Constable is continually changing and developing to accommodate the demand of the role.
