NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

has reported a number of burglaries recently.

If your property is stolen make sure you can describe it to the police by keeping a record of makes, models and unique serial numbers by registering the details onto www.immobilise.com. This is a web based property records system, endorsed and searchable by all UK Police Forces and second hand dealers.

If you update the database stating that an item is lost or stolen, it will be highlighted on police and dealer searches and should assist in returning items to their rightful owners and help bring offenders to justice.

If you want a member of police staff to create an account for you, all you need to do is click on

'immobilise@humberside.pnn.police.uk', fill in your name, address, contact details and your mobile phone details and submit the form. You will then receive an email from Immobilise to confirm your unique login details and you can add your other valuables at a time convenient to you.

How to use immobilise.com

- Get your IT and treasured possessions close to hand, go online and visit www.immobilise.com.
- Create your own free account following the simple instructions, before adding property details including any unique and searchable serial numbers.
- If anything you've logged goes missing, inform the police and update it as lost or stolen on www.immobilise.com to help police and registered second hand dealers recover and return your property.

Small grants scheme

We have submitted an application to a Small Grant scheme run by East Riding of Yorkshire Council for additional salt bins. One of the problems with the salt piles is that they get washed away in wet weather. So we have applied for money to buy some small bins to be placed around the village. Having more bins will make it easier to access the salt in icy conditions.

The council is also planning to apply for funding for a new council noticeboard. This will be bigger than the current board, so that council documents can be seen more easily. It will also be vandal resistant. So fingers crossed we get the funding for this and the salt bins.

Oil buying scheme

Humber and Wolds Rural Partnership has offered to host a community meeting in the village to discuss whether a community oil buying scheme would benefit local residents. You may remember that they distributed a leaflet about the scheme before Christmas. HPC are happy to organise this if there are enough people who are potentially interested and would come to the meeting.
