PUBLIC ACCESS DEFIBRILLATOR for HUGGATE

Yorkshire Ambulance Service has allocated an automatic defibrillator unit for Huggate.

The unit will be installed outside the Wolds Inn and is available to anyone for emergency use.

The unit is locked, but displays an identity number which will also be publicised in the village. If the unit is needed, ring 999 and give the box location (Wolds Inn) and the box number; you will be given the code needed to open the box.

The unit is designed to be usable by anyone, using the written and audio instructions. However training is offered for up to 12 people. If you are interested in being trained to use the unit, and are often available in the parish, please let the Acting Clerk know (huggateclerk@btinternet.com)

More information will be available at the Annual Village Meeting, and it is hoped that a demonstration may be possible.

Residents (and others) are reminded that the Pit Site is currently **CLOSED** while the Japanese Knotweed infestation is treated.

It is reported that the area is still being used for dog walking, and even by people removing wood.



As the site is closed, the Parish Council's insurance does not cover accident to anyone entering the site; neither do the Inclosure Trustees have insurance.

The removal of any plant material risks spreading the weed infestation into the village.
