The Local Plan will set planning policy and guide investment decisions in the East Riding up to 2029. It establishes how much development will take place in the East Riding and where this will be located. Once adopted, all planning applications in the East Riding will be determined against the Local Plan. An examination and consultation process is underway.

The consultation can be viewed in main libraries and customer service centres in the East Riding, and on the website at www.eastriding.gov.uk - type "Examination in Public Information" into the search box.

The WIND FARM debate

At the Village Meeting on 17th July, around 16 residents met our Parish Councillors, to hear some of the arguments in favour of, and against, wind farms in general and the High Wood proposal in particular. The slides used in the presentation will be available on the parish web site very shortly.

While the proposal has not yet reached the stage of being a Planning Application, the discussion will assist Councillors in responding to an Application if one is made. It will also be open to any resident to submit an individual view to ERYC.

RURAL BROADBAND
