Information from “Stop Wolds Wind Farms”

As you all know there are proposals to build two wind farms locally, one at high Wood Bainton and one at Well Springs Neswick.

The action group ‘Stop Wolds Wind Farms’ was set up by a group of concerned people from the affected villages. The group now meet regularly and are busy planning a strategy to oppose the proposals and build support. Please visit our web site for more information. www.stopwoldswindfarms.org. There are many reasons to oppose the proposals

- * The visual impact of the giant turbines, which will be twice the height of York Minster
- * After 10 years the output from turbines is severely diminished and maintenance is very high
- * The steel towers are anchored in a platform of more than a thousand tons of concrete and steel rebar, 30 to 50 feet across and anywhere from 6 to 30 feet deep
- * As the proposed turbines are so large, transporting them is likely to require some major changes to road layouts, including the removal of some roundabouts

ERYC Residents' Survey Results 2014

ERYC's residents' survey reports:

- * 97% were satisfied with the East Riding as a place to live, which is 14% higher than the national result of 83%
- * 82% were satisfied with the way the council runs things.
- * 71% agreed that the council provided value for money, which is 18% higher than the national result of 53%.
- * 68% expressed confidence in the council's ability to manage its finances and services.

ERYC “dog fouling partnership scheme”

ERYC is inviting volunteers from Parish Councils for training in dog control issues. The invitation states “Our intention would be to work closely with those we have trained to improve our service and increase the level of enforcement against fouling.”

Dozens of town and parish councils have agreed to take part in the battle to rid East Riding streets of dog mess. Councillors from 80 councils have signed up for training on the types of evidence needed before a fine can be issued.
