Elections

Yes, the national campaigning seems to have gone on for ever, but please do remember that there are also local elections planned for May 7th. High Wood Wind Farm

The main item for discussion at the March Parish Council meeting was the proposed wind farm development at High Wood. We have been granted an extension for return of comments – we now have until 1st June 2015. At the meeting it was decided to share out the task of reading and summarising all the details of the application between the councillors in time for the April meeting. We will then prepare an overview of key issues based on the EDF application and comments from independent agencies. This will be included in a postal survey of all households in Huggate Parish, to get a view of what the majority of people think. The council decided in advance that a **NON RESPONSE** to the survey would indicate a neutral opinion, with no strong feelings for or against the proposed wind farm. So if you do have an opinion, please do complete the survey – that will make sure your view is taken into account.

When preparing our response we will bear the following points in mind:

- The ERYC planning authority must consider the parish view
- HPC comments & recommendations should fit with local and national policy, or may be ignored.

It's important that the Parish Council deals consistently and transparently with any planning application. Over recent years and following discussions with ERYC we have developed the following template. For any planning application, HPC should consider:

- The application, not the applicant
- Relevant local and national planning policy
- A site's planning history
- Impact on traffic, roads and parking
- Archaeology and heritage assets
- Whether any harms outweigh the benefits to the population as a whole

The fact that the highest levels of contamination are cardboard is in some ways encouraging as residents are obviously attempting to do the right thing. However, it would seem that the message has not got through to all of our residents.

We are also experiencing a lot of **food waste** in the green bins, which **should of course be put into the brown bins.**
