The East Riding library service offers library members free access to electronic versions of over 50 popular magazine titles. Whatever your hobby or interest, you can enjoy a full-colour interactive version of the latest editions, downloaded to any computer, tablet or smartphone. Once downloaded, you can read the magazines offline.

Librarian Katherine Richardson says: “It’s a different library experience - you don’t have to come into the library itself. There’s unlimited access to the magazines, with no holds, due dates or charges. Unlike borrowing other items from the library it does not need to be returned or renewed. There’s something for everyone. E-magazines are great for reading on the go, on your lunch break or a train journey.”

The wide variety of free titles includes: Amateur Photographer, Auto Express, BBC Good Food, Countryfile, Health & Fitness, Hello! magazine, Ideal Home, Marie Claire, New Scientist and Woman’s Own.
