Parish Council Annual Village Meeting

Councillors wanted to pass on their thanks to those who attended the meeting. The Councillors also wanted to ask that if there was anyone interested in joining the Parish Council or if they wanted to offer any ideas to contact Audrey, Parish Council Clerk. The meeting is a great opportunity to voice any ideas or opinions you may have and can be really helpful in providing direction for the Parish Council to focus and include what the village want to see. Some ideas have already been considered, such as improvements in information signage for the village and work is going forward to provide a professional Village information board, as seen in others villages. Neighbourhood Watch scheme

The scheme is just a way of formalising what being a “good neighbour” is about. Looking out and being vigilant about what's going on around us and keeping safe. Whilst we live in a small close community it is important not to be complacent. Watching and reporting any unusual events is a way in which we can continue to enjoy our environment, safely. The Parish Council is shortly to discuss any improvements which could link into the Village Emergency Plan to support communication for any alerts of incidents in the area. Whilst fortunately these incidents are small in number we need to be aware.

Fracking

Fracking continues to be a live issue in our parish and those adjacent. Whilst there are mixed opinions as to the wider benefits and shortfalls in relation to fracking, there is a need to understand the impact for our Parish and surrounding areas. We have all recently received a leaflet through our doors and it is expected that this may continue over the coming months. Village Well area

Work has progressed really well and we now have two new benches to be sited adjacent to the Village Well. The Council is also currently pulling together ideas and styles for the village information board which will be erected next to the seating area. A meeting with a graphic designer is planned over the coming months to discuss. Listed below are the key areas which will be included on the Village information board but if there is anything you feel is missing and should be considered please contact Audrey, Parish Council Clerk. Secretary. Please can we ask for any ideas to be with Audrey by **Friday 4 August 2017** so we can review at the August Parish Council meeting.

Items to be included on Village information board are; St Mary's Church, The Wolds Inn, The Wolds National trail, Huggate Dykes (bronze age earthworks), David Hockney trail, local flora and fauna and history of the village well.

Driffield Road Pit site

Initial scoping is being undertaken by the Parish Council on the proposed project to utilise this site for Village car parking for walkers etc. and further updates will be provided as the exercise allows.

Bottom pond

There is again some great progress as outlined in last months Huggate News. Special thanks to Lesley and Gerry Whelan for their continued work and support in relation to the improvements in this area. Planting is starting over the coming weeks with an order placed for trees planned for August after the summer growing period. This area has already been greatly improved and feedback from the village has been very positive and is now somewhere we can all enjoy.

Driffield Road repairs

The Parish Council is continuing communications with East Riding of Yorkshire Council to seek improvements in the poor condition of this Road in particular.
