### 1. NEW PARISH COUNCIL CLERK

The Council is delighted that Emma Waslin has been appointed as the new Clerk to the Council. Emma is was born in this parish and now lives in the village. We wish her well in her new position and hope that she enjoys working with the Council.

Emma took over her duties from Audrey Johnson our outgoing clerk at the October meeting. Audrey has filled the post of clerk for three years and has been a great asset to the council. She has carried out her duties diligently while at all times maintaining a sense of humour. A good clerk is essential to the running of any Parish Council and Audrey has been one of the best. All members of the council would like to thank her for her unstinting support during her time as our clerk and for the cheerful and efficient manner with which she has dealt with the many and complex parish council issues.

### 2. COUNCILLOR JACQUIE LAZENBY

Sadly we have to say goodbye to another member of the council team who has been a cheerful and active member over the past couple of years. Jacquie Lazenby has left the village to live near Leeds. It was a pleasure to work with Jacquie whose effervescent personality combined with a good understanding of local government matters which was of great use to the council on many occasions.

### 3. VILLAGE WELL

Most of the work to improve the appearance of the village well area has now been carried out. There is still an information board to be designed and erected and further shrubs together with trees to be planted by the well and in the amenity area adjacent to the bottom pond. I hope parishioners will agree that this project, even in its early stages, has lifted the appearance of this whole central area considerably. The benches in particular look very classy and will be much appreciated. The Parish Council has paid for the benches but a parishioner, who wishes to remain anonymous, has paid for the work carried out by the gardeners and we are very grateful to him for his generosity. Another resident is paying for a feature tree to be planted by the well.

### 4. QUIZ NIGHT

Another quiz Night is being organised by the council in the Wolds Inn, courtesy of John and Jane Leaver, on Thursday the 16<sup>th</sup> November at 7pm. This has proved to be a popular event so please come and test your general knowledge skills whilst enjoying a drink and the famous Wolds Inn steak pie. ### 5. OLD VILLAGE PIT AREA

The old village pit area on the left as you leave the village toward Wetwang is to be opened up as a public area. At the moment it is over grown with shrubs and weeds but this is to be cleared so that paths can be created. A local farmer has agreed to take on this work and when the site is fit for use a notification will appear in the Huggate News.

### 6. LITTER BIN

It has been noted that there is a need for a litter bin at the top of the town road near the village post box. This has to be applied for through ERYC so that it will be emptied by the council.

### 7. DETERIORATION OF ROAD SURFACE – DRIFFIELD ROAD

The Council is still trying to get resurfacing work carried out on the bend of the Driffield road as you leave the village towards Wetwang. This has been in a bad state for some considerable time. East Riding Highways Department has made one ineffectual attempt to patch the road but it remains hazardous to traffic and pedestrians alike. The council will continue to press ERYC for some action to improve the road and hope that persistence will pay off eventually.

### 8. REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY WREATH

The Council has approved the ordering of a poppy wreath to be placed on the village war memorial on Remembrance Sunday. The cost will be paid to the Royal British Legion on behalf of all parishioners.
