

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH— village co-ordinators needed

East Riding of Yorkshire Council and Humberside Police would like to sign up more Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators in Huggate Village as we are currently expanding the numbers of groups in the rural areas.

The purpose of Neighbourhood Watch is to make our local areas safer places to live. We can also advise residents how to deal with wider issues such as fly tipping and anti-social behaviour. The role of coordinator is not at all time consuming; it is simply about sharing crime prevention information between East Riding of Yorkshire Council, Humberside Police and residents.
