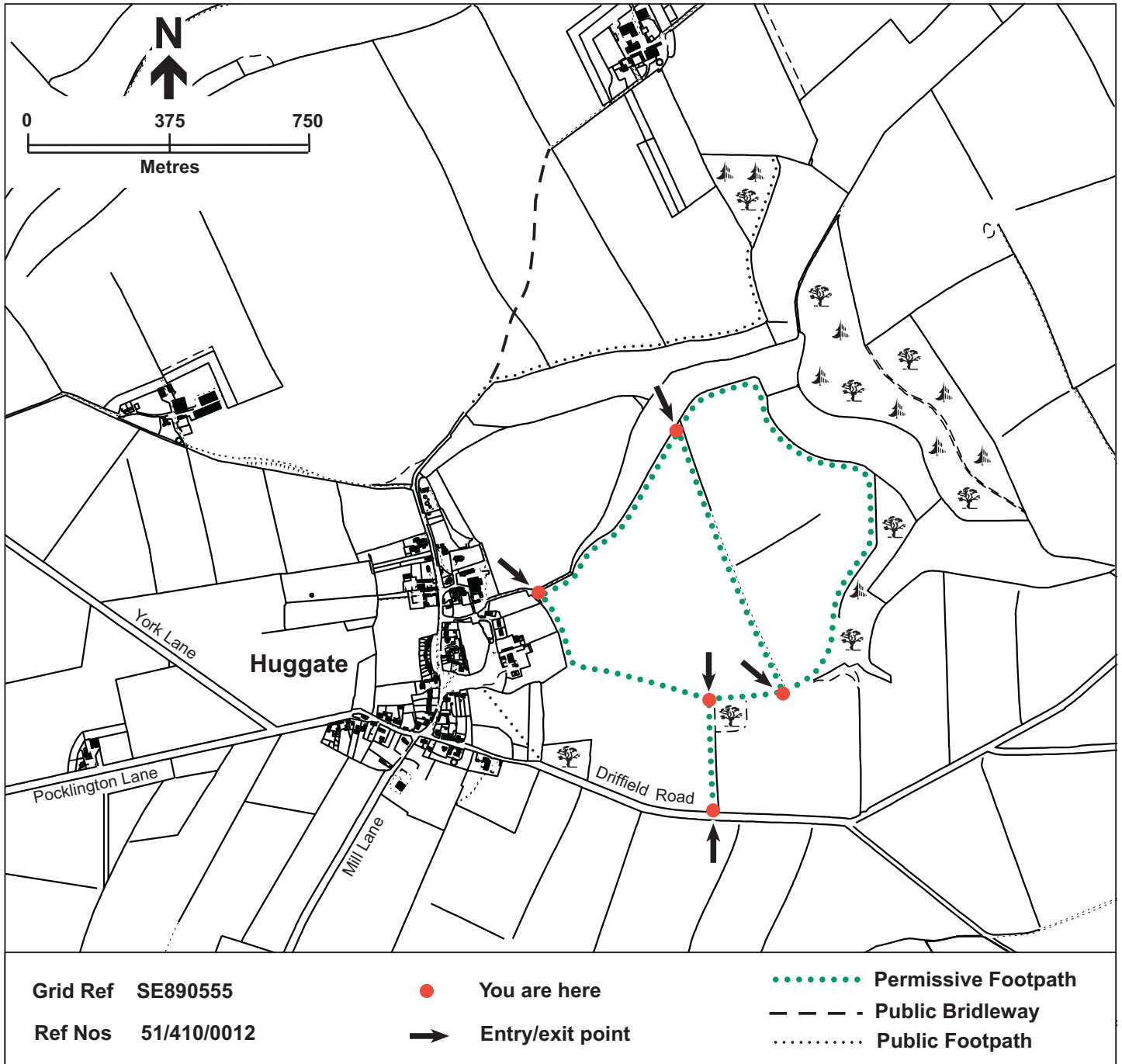


CONSERVATION WALKS

You are welcome to use this permissive footpath route around arable fields at Huggate with views across the Yorkshire Wolds. It is for the use of walkers and way marks are in place to guide you around the route. The Eastern loop will be closed for six months of the year to protect gamebirds. Hedges and field margins on the farm are being managed to benefit wildlife, especially farmland birds. Please take care to keep to the route and to avoid disturbing nesting birds along other hedgerows. Please keep your dog on a lead as we are also trying to protect important farmland birds such as lapwing, grey partridge and corn bunting.



This access has been provided under the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs' farm conservation schemes, which help farmers and land managers protect and improve the countryside, its wildlife and history. It is permissive access and no new rights of way are being created. Existing rights of way are not affected. Please follow the Country Code and observe any other requirements shown above. Do not disturb wildlife, livestock or other visitors and in particular keep dogs under control. This is working farmland so please take care; people using this site do so at their own risk. Access ends in September 2012.
